Liturgy of the Word

Genesis 2:18-24: The two of them become one flesh

Psalms 128: May the Lord bless us all the days of our lives.

Hebrews 2:9-11: He who consecrates and those who are being consecrated all have one origin

Mark 10:2-16 Therefore, what God has joined together, let no human being separate

Today's first reading and Gospel may be difficult for many, especially divorced and LGBTQIA+ Catholics. The specifics and details speak of the traditional ideal of marriage. But the underlying theme is one of God's infinite love for us and desire that we live in happiness, of which companionship and ultimately partnership are foundational. But whether we are married, single, divorced, or widowed, we each have companionship with Jesus. The reading from Hebrews emphasizes the solidarity we have with him, who became fully human so that by the grace of God he could suffer and die like us. No matter our situation, as we sing in the responsorial psalm, may the Lord bless us all the days of our lives.
